Trent Barret Shield

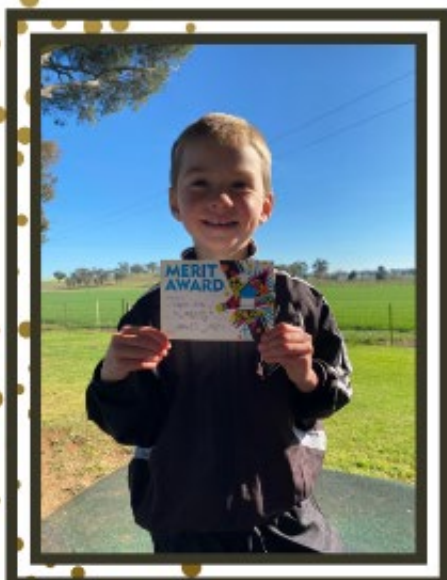
