Maths Board Games

Board games are making a big splash in our classrooms as an exciting way to teach mathematics skills! When students engage in board games, they dive into hands-on learning experiences that make maths concepts come alive. 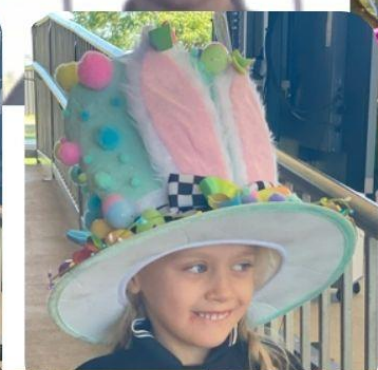

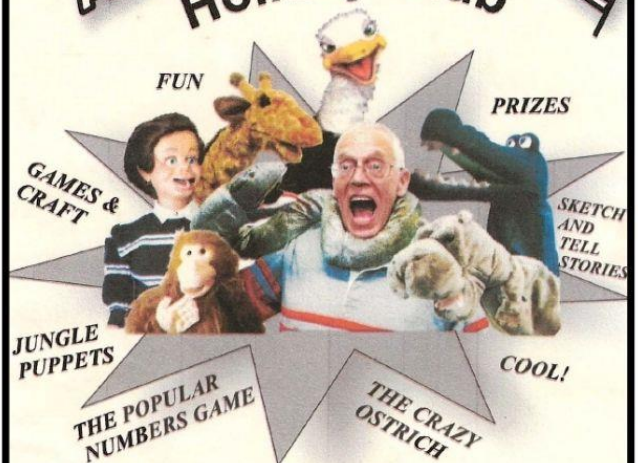

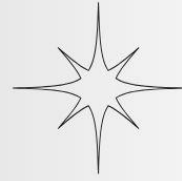
